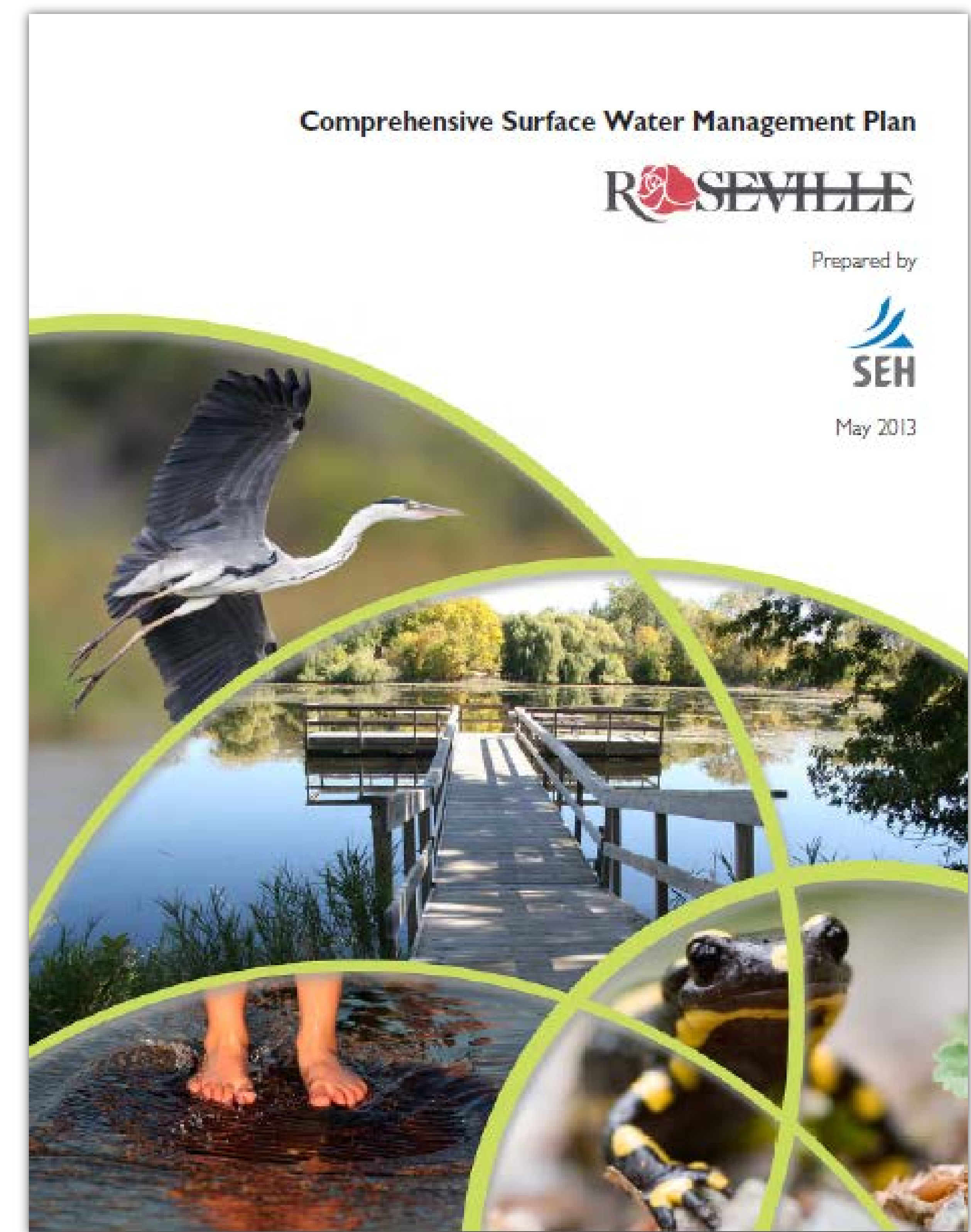
# Reason for Plan Updates – Why now?

Minnesota Rules were updated in July of 2015 and now require that:

- Must be revised once every ten years
- Aligned with Comprehensive Plan schedule
- Must adopt the plan between January 1, 2017 and December 31, 2018.

Previous Versions of the City's Surface Water Management Plan:

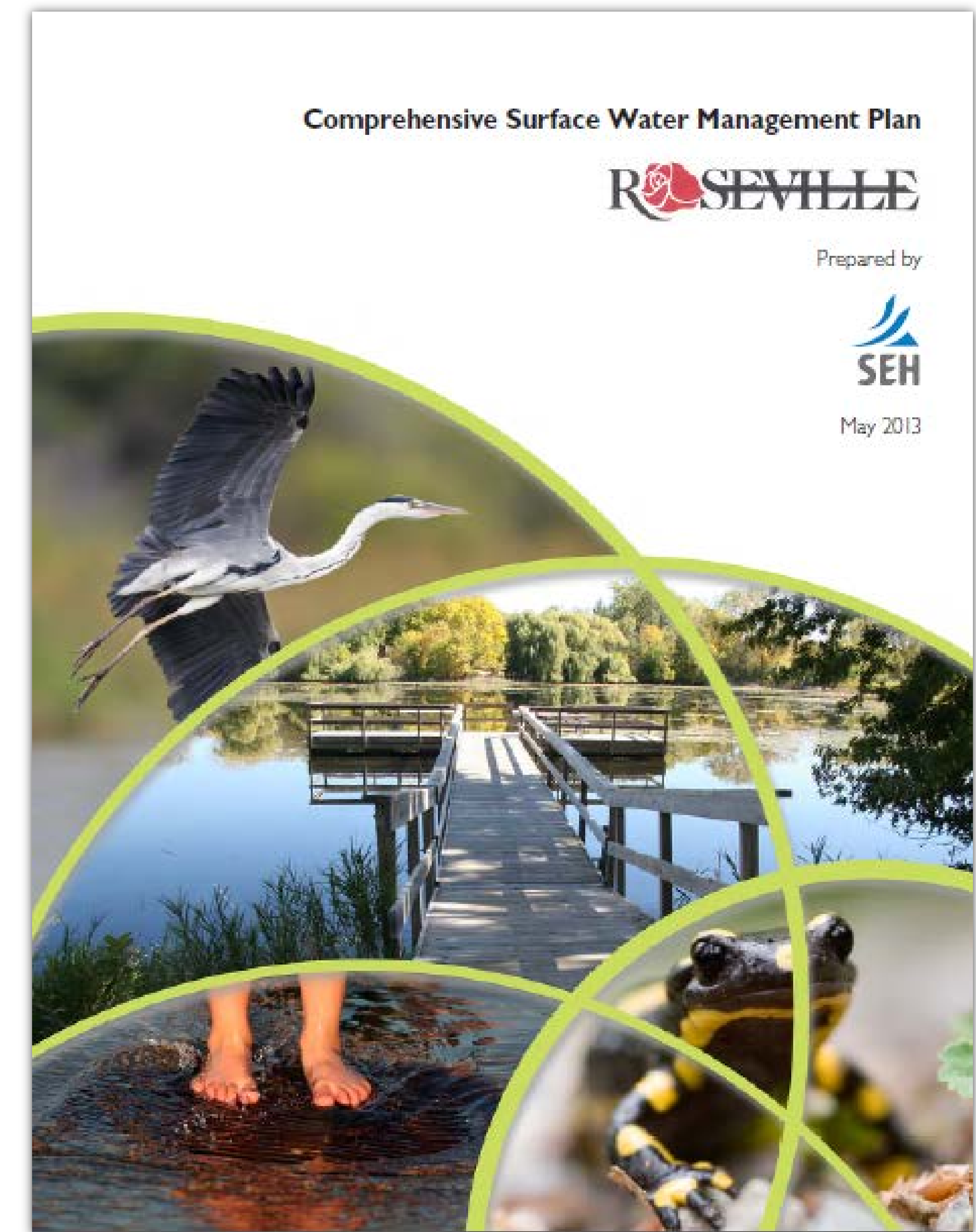
- Original Plan – 1990

- Current Plan – 2013





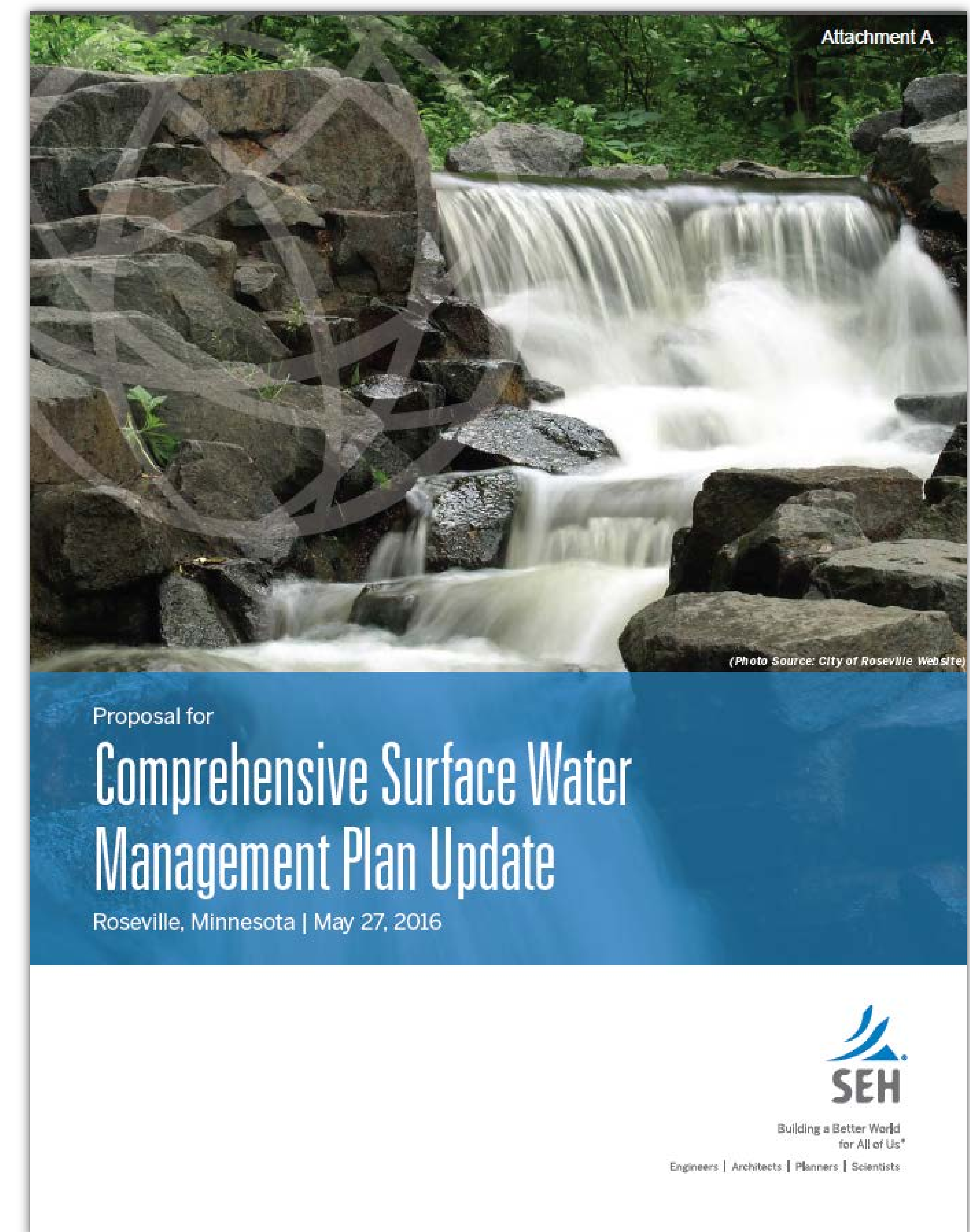
# Current CSWMP (2013)

  - Public open house coordination with Comprehensive Plan update process





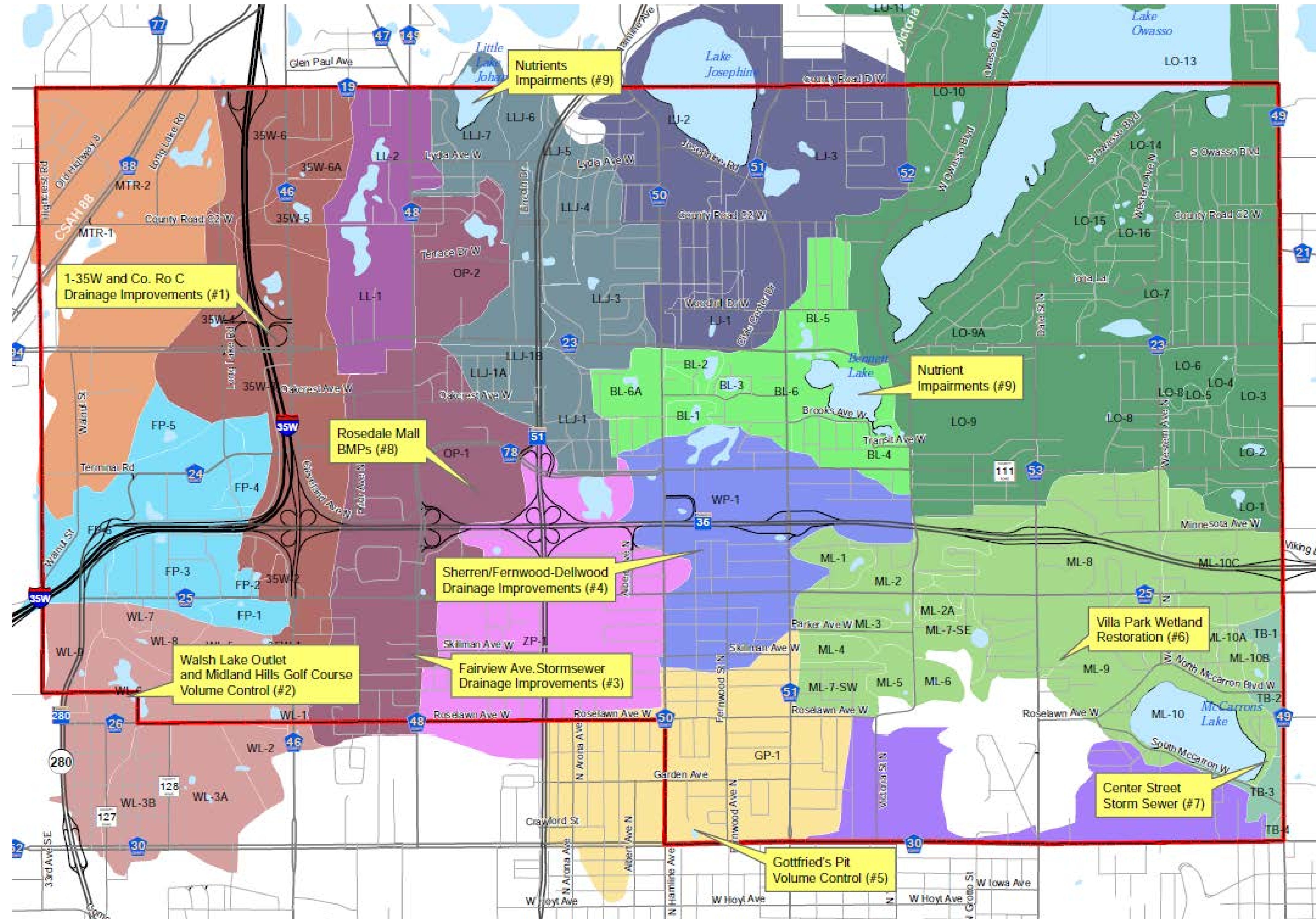
# Current (2013) Plan Goals

Goal	Goal Statement
Goal 1 – Flood Protection and Runoff Management	<b>Provide flood protection</b> to the maximum extent practicable for all residents and structures and to protect the integrity of our drainage and detention systems through runoff management
Goal 2 – Surface Water Protection	<b>Maintain or improve the water quality</b> and ecological integrity of the City’s lakes, ponds, and wetlands
Goal 3 – Groundwater Protection	<b>Protect the quality and quantity of groundwater</b> through collaboration with local and state agencies managing groundwater resources
Goal 4 – Public Education and Outreach	<b>Promote stewardship and increase awareness</b> of land and water resources through public education and outreach
Goal 5 – Pollution Prevention and Maintenance	Protect the quality of the City’s water resources through <b>pollution prevention, good housekeeping practices, and routine maintenance.</b>
Goal 6 – Coordination and Collaboration	To <b>simplify and streamline processes</b> and draw upon the expertise and resources of other local, state, and federal agencies in water resources management efforts.
Goal 7 - Sustainability	Achieve the water quality and water resources needs of the City based on the foundation of <b>efficient use of community resources.</b> In this approach both capital costs and long-term operational costs will be considered as well as the overall costs of a given project towards <b>protection and/or improvement of the City’s water resources.</b>
